



The "Pittsburgh Limited" MCR-MER joint convention was Great! Loren McCullough and his crew did an outstanding job. I got to see some of the great clinics on Thursday night. There was a special series of clinics on the PRR, the Pennsylvania Railroad Symposium "Celebrating the 150th Anniversary of the Standard Railroad of the World, 1846-1996." I presented a clinic on PRR Box Cars 1930's-60's early Friday morning. Others who presented clinics on various PRR subjects included Paul Backenstose, Ken McCorry, Doug Gurin and John Teichmoeller. Due to the MER Board Meeting, I did not have time to go on any prototype or industrial tours, but I heard they were great, especially the tour of the PRR Conway Yard. On Saturday, more clinics and a chance to view some of the models in the contest room along with checking out items for sale in the train show. In the evening I attended the banquet and awards ceremony, which was followed by a stunning 3-D slide show by Mitch Dakelman. On Sunday I visited some home layouts, including Neal Schorr's HO South Pennsylvania RR and Don Cassler's large HO "M&K Division of the B&O." I was also able to see the large O Scale layout of Larry Kline, the Youghiogheny Terminal, and the vary large club layout of the Pittsburgh Model Railroad Historical Society.



## DIRECTIONS TO THE CLARION HOTEL


**New Jersey Turnpike** - Take Exit 4 off the turnpike. After paying toll, go towards Philadelphia/Camden. Clarion Hotel at Mount Laurel on right side about 1/4 mile off the exit.

**Interstate 295** - Take Exit 36A off the interstate. Clarion Hotel at Mount Laurel on left side; take the first jughandle to make the U-turn.

**Philadelphia International Airport** - Take Route 94 North to Walt Whitman Bridge Exit (76 East). Take bridge; follow signs for 295 North Trenton. Take Exit 36A (Route 73 South). Continue 73 to South to Fellowship Road.

**Benjamin Franklin Bridge** - Exit toll booth - bear left on Admiral Wilson Blvd. to overpass. Continue to bear left and this will lead you to Route 38 East; approximately 8 miles to Rte. 73 South (Acura car dealer on left).

**At Fellowship Road** - take jughandle for U-turn on to Route 73 North. Keep to right after left turn; Clarion Hotel at Mount Laurel is on right approximately 250 feet past light.

## The Narrow Gauge Car Shop BLUE LANTERN AWARD

The Blue Lantern Award goes to a judged contest model containing no more than 40% commercial parts that best represents an example of either branchline, shortline, or private line operating equipment and/or facilities. This contest is sponsored by the NARROW GAUGE CAR SHOP and is administered by Bill "Terry" Nesbit, AP chairman of MERs Susquehanna Div. 11.

A full slate of non-rail activities is being planned for those desiring to stray from trains. ## SIG ROOMS


There will be several rooms dedicated to the NMRA SIG's (Special Interests Groups). The SIG groups will provide displays on model and prototype railroading.


## TOURS

On Thursday afternoon, we'll be shuttling off the first 50 registered attendees to Conrails' Eastern Region Control Center located down the street from the hotel. Conrail controls the entire Philadelphia Region from the facility and features the latest in railroad dispatching technology. The shuttle will start in mid afternoon and run through early evening. Friday will offer the choice of two tours starting with the PATCO shops tour in the morning. See where PATCO (operators of the Lindenwold High Speed Line from South Jersey to Philadelphia) maintains its fleet of high speed commuter cars. In the afternoon, you'll have a chance to visit the Holt Cargo Rail/Marine facility at the port of Philadelphia along the Delaware River. You'll be able to catch one tour and still participate in the layout lottery, giving you ample opportunities of model and prototype pleasures. Lunch will be available at the Hotel between tours. Both the PATCO and Holt tours are limited seating so register early. On Saturday, we'll spend the day on the Southern Railroad of New Jersey with a fantrip from Salem, NJ to Swedesboro.
